Dak Gomtang (Korean chicken soup)



A comforting, delicious, and easy to make chicken noodle soup. There is an additional recipe for a spicy sauce which can be added to the soup. Dak Gomtang is often eaten with rice, so be sure to make some rice on the side for an authentic experience! This recipe was provided by Ms. Kang Geumok, who runs Kyoushitsu Meari, where she introduces Korean culture to people in Niigata through Korean-Japanese conversation cafes, Korean cooking classes, and patchwork. Ingredients

1 chicken ½ onion 5 jujubes 1 carrot

10 cloves of garlic 100g cellophane noodles (harusame)

10 niboshi (small dried fish) 20g ginger

3 green onions (green portion only) 2 potatoes

(Optional) Rice: 150g glutinous rice (mochi rice) & 150g white rice

Method

- 1. Put cellophane noodles in water and boil.
- 2. (Optional) For rice: Soak rice in water for 30 minutes and then cook.
- Wash chicken and place in large pot with 2 2.5 liters of water.
- <u>Yang-nyeom sauce</u> (for spicy soup): 2 Tbsp chili powder
- 3 Tbsp chicken broth
- ½ Tbsp grated garlic
- 1 tsp sardine extract
- 4. Clean the jujubes, leave the skin on the ginger, remove the skin from the garlic cloves, wash the carrots and leave the skin on, and remove the onion's skin.
- 5. Place ingredients from step 4 into the pot with the chicken and simmer for 30 50 minutes.
- 6. After the chicken is fully cooked, remove it and the vegetables from the pot. Let the chicken cool and then remove the skin and bones. Break the chicken up into bite-sized pieces and season with salt and pepper.
- 7. Put the large bones back in the pot and add potatoes. Boil. Lightly season with salt.
- 8. Put the cellophane noodles in a bowl and place chicken and potatoes on top. Pour the soup on top. Garnish with green onions.
- 9. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
